Assignment Title: Supervision for the Weighbridge and Tire Shredding Contracts.

The Government of Sint Maarten has received financing from the World Bank toward the cost of the Emergency Debris Management Project and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services.

The consulting services ("the Services") include the provision of contract administration and site supervision services for two contracts, listed below:

- 1. Provision of weighbridge and traffic control arms and associated works; and
- 2. Tire shredding services.

This includes the supervision of the minor civil works for, the installation, commissioning, and calibration of the weighbridge, and the setting up of a tire shredder and the tire shredding process to completion.

The expected implementation period is within 12 months, and the assignment is expected to start in June 2024.

The National Recovery Program Bureau (NRPB) now invites eligible consulting firms ("Consultants") to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultants should provide information demonstrating that they have the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. The selection criteria are:

1. The consulting firm must be duly registered or incorporated, either on a national or international level.



- 2. Minimum of 10 years of experience in management and supervision of projects.
- 3. Technical experience in Plant and equipment installation
 - a. Experience with weighbridge technology and installation requirements.
 - b. Experience in General Plant and/or equipment installation
- 4. Experience in industrial or solid waste shredding.
- 5. Demonstrated financial stability and capacity to manage supervision projects for one year of implementation.
- 6. Qualification and Experience of Key experts based on the TOR requirements.

The attention of interested Consultants is drawn to Section III, paragraphs, 3.14, 3.16, and 3.17 of the World Bank's "Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers" dated November 2020 ("Procurement Regulations"), setting forth the World Bank's policy on conflict of interest.

Consultants may associate with other firms to enhance their qualifications but should indicate clearly whether the association is in the form of a joint venture and/or a subconsultancy. In the case of a joint venture, all the partners in the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable for the entire contract, if selected.

A Consultant will be selected in accordance with the Consultant's qualifications-based selection method set out in the Procurement Regulations.
